Step 1

Use the Handbook to **familiarise yourself with the relevant Course Structure** – Check your code (ED21, ED23, CC23).

This information is critical particularly for ED23 & CC23 students who will select Teaching Area electives throughout the course. Knowing the number and nature of electives required will avoid

disappointment and unnecessary costs throughout the course. Pay particular attention to the 100, 200, 300 level information provided (see screenshot). Students should follow the relevant course structure to ensure

Step 2

- 1. <u>Mark any previously completed units</u> (continuing students will find this via *myCHC* Results)
- 2. <u>Mark any units for which Transfer of Credit (TC) or Advanced Standing (AS)</u> has been credited
- 3. Identify the relevant semester of your course (see LH column of table)
- 4. <u>Identify any outstanding units</u> (those not yet marked in previous semesters of the Course Progression template).
- 5. <u>Check the Handbook section on "*Prerequisite Unit Information*" to ensure necessary foundation units are completed in the most effective and efficient sequence.</u>

Step 4

Open myCHC / **Online Class Enrolment** and select relevant CORE and ELECTIVE units available this semester.

***Caution** – Several units may appear in the ELECTIVE offerings. Select ONLY those relevant to your course (see your personal saved Course Progression map) beginning with the 100 level before progression to 200 or 300 level.

Step 5

Secondary - ED23 and CC23 only

At times students may need to explore Cross-Institutional Studies (CIS) to locate in relevant electives units (200 or 300 level particularly) in specialist teaching areas.

- 1. Explore <u>Open Universities Australia</u> should CHC semester offerings not meet elective / teaching area requirements.
- 2. Contact the proposed CIS institution to ensure 200 or 300 level requirements are met prior to enrolment.
- 3. Submit the <u>Application for Cross-Institutional Enrolment Form A</u> to ensure credit is applied to your Student Records (myCHC).

Step 6

Maintain and update your personal Course Progression map as a navigation tool throughout your course.
